

A Note from the Church Council President

On March 10th, an intruder entered our church through the doors at the prayer garden. From there, he went down the stairs into the Fellowship Hall. While in the Fellowship Hall, he took a projector and a DVD player. He then entered the kitchen where the camera captured a picture him. (This picture has been used by the Hickory City Police in their search for the suspect.) He continued down the hallway into the Centro Latino area and took several items from their classrooms.

The investigation has been taking longer than we anticipated and finally turned over to Investigator Whitener of the Hickory Police Department. He did tell me that they do have a suspect at this time but have yet to locate him.

We have put together a security team at the church and they are in the process of implementing safety procedures. They have installed outside cameras around the church building as well as additional cameras inside the church. We do want everyone to feel safe while in our church building and we are doing our best to see that no one with intent to steal something or harm someone enters our building.

We will keep you posted on all the safety procedures and the steps we are taking to ensure the safety of Pastor Terri, staff and the congregation.


