My prayer is that this letter finds you well and joyous as we begin to enter into the season of Lent and journey with Jesus to the Cross. I hope that if you are able, you will participate in the many activities that we have planned in these coming weeks to experience Christ in new and profound ways.

Our journey begins on Tuesday, March 4th with our Pancake Supper. This year we plan to 'put away' the Alleluias as we solemnly walk with Jesus.

On Wednesday, you have two opportunities to receive the impositions of the ashes – 12:30PM or 7:00PM.

Why do we do this? And why is this important?

The ashes that we receive on our forehead on Ash Wednesday are to serve as a powerful visual and reminder of our mortality. We are only dust and one day — to dust we shall return.

We all have a choice in life...We can either return to the dust of the earth without a connection to God or we can return to the dust of the earth with a connection to God.

There is only one way to have a connection to God – And that is to be reconciled to God – To be right (righteous) before God...

And that is through *repentance*. Repentance comes from a change of heart and mind that involves turning away from sin and turning towards God for forgiveness. Repentance is motivated by love for God and a desire to obey his commandments.

In this Lenten journey, together we will confront our sin and acknowledge our inability to live up to all God has created us to be and our need to be forgiven. No matter how far we have become in our spiritual journeys, each of us have sinned and fallen short of the glory of God. (Romans 3:23)






